I. Edwardsville Township Offers the Following Services and Programs:

A. Road & Bridge Department

1. Christmas Tree Recycling
 - a) Collects recycled trees, then mulches them to be used in public gardens and parks across the community.
2. Tire Recycling
 - a) Collects tires for recycling
3. Road Maintenance & Resurfacing
 - a) Maintains and resurfaces Township roads.
 - b) Maintains Township roads and bridges by plowing snow and ice amidst winter weather.
4. E-Waste Recycle
 - a) Collects hazards e-waste to be carefully disposed of.
5. MS4 Program
 - a) Regulates MS4 Program to prevent hazards and harmful pollutants from entering local bodies of water.
6. Township Mowing
 - a) Maintains Township property via mowing.
7. Ditch Digging/Waterway Maintenance
 - a) Maintains culverts to prevent water from flowing into roadways.
 - b) Digs ditches to maintain waterways
8. Maintain Signs
 - a) Maintains road signs for 911 dispatching and traffic control
9. Tree Removal
 - a) Removes trees interfering with traffic pathways and constituents.
10. Record Keeping of Road Maintenance & Personal Records
 - a) Maintains township records per IL statute.
 - b) Includes drug tests for personnel
11. Mosquito Defogger (Intergovernmental Agreement with Glen Carbon)
 - a) Utilizes mosquito fogger to control mosquito population.
12. Prepare Tax Levee & Budget
 - a) Prepares and files Edwardsville Township Road and Bridge levee and budget.
13. Trash Maintenance
 - a) Removes trash from Township roads to reduce pollution and maintain Township jurisdiction.
14. Upkeep at Edwardsville Township Community Park (“Airplane Park”) assist park staff maintain Airplane Park, per request.
15. Madison County Mitigation Planning Committee
 - a) Increase community resilience and facilitate the expeditious recovery of the region. Identify projects and activities that reduce the negative impacts of identified hazards in the County
16. Provide Emergency On-call Man Power
 - a) Full time and Part time employees on 24 hour call out incase of emergency-snow, ice, tree debris removal, severe storm debris, flooding, traffic control

A. Road & Bridge Department

a. Village of Glen Carbon

- i. This allows both Edwardsville Township and the Village of Glen Carbon to spray both municipalities for mosquitos while saving money and space for storage.

b. Fort Russell

- i. Allows both Townships to complete snow and ice removal on adjoining sections of roadway on Old Carpenter Rd and Drda Lane belonging to the other Township up to a place better suited to turn around.

By participating in these intergovernmental agreements this allows the Edwardsville Township Road & Bridge District to potentially save a great deal of money. While continuing to have a good relationship with neighboring municipalities.

VI. What Have We Done Well?

In the past 10 years Edwardsville Township Road & Bridge, has reduced the General Road levy by 29% please see attached chart. I have been able to accomplish this by very strict budgeting, precise planning, and dedication to my job. I am proud of the condition of the township roads. Numerous road upgrades and reconstructions have been made with no tax increases. The road district is on 24-hour emergency call for severe weather conditions, ice, snow, storms, flooding. We also work with Madison County Highway Department through their bidding process, to help keep material cost down when purchasing salt, culvert piping, road oil and rock.

VIII. Studies on Governmental Efficiencies

In preparing this report, we reviewed several studies on local government efficiency. These studies show that:

- The average local government in Illinois serves 1800 residents compared to the national median of 2850 individuals
- Most townships in Illinois have no bonded indebtedness. Together with road districts they are an integral element of local democracy. Township expenditures have grown at a lower rate than those of any other level of government since 1992.
- Townships have lower labor costs and employ mostly part time employees.
